### Minted to pay tribute to Julius Caesar in 53 BC?



**1. Early Whaddon Chase.** Sills class 1. Catuvellauni. c.53 BC. AV stater. 16-18mm. 5.79g. Wreath motif with rounded wings, ornaments in angles./ Horse r, wing-motif above, ringed-pellet below, exergual lines below with corded line between. ABC 2433, VA 1476-5, BMC 306-09, DK 457,

S 32. *Good VF, golden gold, three wings clearly displayed.* £850  
On 14 February 1849 a ploughboy called Grange discovered the Whaddon Chase gold hoard in Little Horwood, Bucks. In 1951 C.E.Stevens suggested it was related to tribute, an idea later confirmed by Dr John Sills in 1997 and 2017. Illustrated in *Coin News* and *World Coin News*, August 2019 ([this coin](#)).



**IBERIAN** *Earliest recorded Celtic inscriptions c.600 BC*  
**2. Iberian Galley.** c.1st cent. BC. AE semis, indigenous imitation. 18mm. 4.08g. Head of Saturn r, reversed-S behind./ Prow of galley, S above, [RO]MA below. Burgos R 44. *VF, clear head and prow.* Ex Don Lee coll, ex Toscus coll. £65

**SEQUANI** (*Doubs*), E France, cap. Vesontio (*Besançon*).  
**3. Quintus Doci Sam.** c.57-50 BC. AR denarius. 13mm. 1.92g. Helmeted head l, Q DOCI./ Horse l, [Q DOCI] SAM F. LT 5405, BMC 346-365. Gd VF, lightly toned, clear lettering. £75

The legend indicates that Quintus Doci, a Romanised Gaul, was the son of Sam. Minted to help fund the Armorican revolt of 56 BC.

**4. Ogmios and Lyre. W-Nose and Lentoid Eye.** Rybot

group III. c.57-56 BC. AR stater. 19-21mm. 6.52g. Head of Armorican sun-god right with lentoid eye and W-nose./ Human-headed horse r, sun-sceptre above, lyre below. LT-, DT 2334-35, Rybot 45-50, Hooker 22-27. *VF, bright silver, clear lyre.* Ex Jean Teitgen coll, 1974. £175  
Minted to help fund Armorican revolt of 56 BC.

**IMPORTED** *Gaulish coins found in England.*  
**5. Gallic War Uniface.** Sills class 2. Ambiani. c.57-56 BC. AV stater. 16mm. 6.23g. Almost blank./ M-shaped horse r, charioteer's arms and pellet triad above, large pellet below, 'coffee-bean' in front and behind. ABC 16 var., VA 52, DK 9, S 11. *EF, rich golden gold, well centred horse.* Fd. Black Notley, Essex. £600

Struck to pay troops to fight Caesar. The class 2 horse is high-backed and galloping, not standing.

**6. Defaced Die.** Sills G-B Ba1, dies 1/1. Morini. c.200-150 BC. AV stater. 17mm. 7.58g. Crossed lines over left-facing Apollo head./ Horse r, 'rising sun' motif below. ABC 7, LT-, DT 89, Sills 331, VA 30, S 3. *VF for issue, golden gold.*  
**RR** only 15 others recorded. **£450**  
 Possibly made for export trade with Kent where most have been found.

**CANTIACI** Kent, cap. Durovernum (Canterbury).

**7. Late Weald Net.** Sills class 1b. c.50-30 BC. Base AV stater. 18mm. 4.18g. Blank./ Horse l, ringed-pellets around, pellet below tail, net below. ABC 180, VA 150, BMC 2467, DK 60, S 169. *VF, round flan of light rose-gold with lovely pink tones.* **RRRR** only two others recorded, including one in the British Museum. **UNIQUE** reverse die **£600**  
 "The Weald Net type [ABC 177] is the earliest identifiable stater coinage struck in Kent" says Dr John Sills (*DK*, p.34). On this excessively rare Late Weald Net type the ringed-pellets above the horse are not linked. This is the first we've had.

**8. Massalia Bull MA.** c.late 3rd to mid 2nd century BC. Cast AE. 15mm. 3.92g. Head of Apollo l./ Bull butting right, MA above. ABC 115, LT-, BN 1882 Blanchet (1905) 92 variant. *VF, as cast, chunky flan, glossy dark green patina.*  
**RR** only about 20 others recorded from UK. **£200**  
 Arguably "Britain's most important imported coin" as we suggest in *Britain's First Coins*, p.6.

**9. Kentish Horse Brooch.** Sills class 1, Canopy. c.45-40 BC. AV quarter stater. 10mm. 1.36g. Slightly banded./ Horse leaping right, U-shape motif above. ABC 201, VA 158, BMC 371-74, DK 66, S 44. *Gd VF, golden gold, well centred, bold horse and brooch. Fd. Horley, Surrey.*  
**RR** **£450**

**10. Dubnovellaunos Winged Beast.** c.25BC-AD5. AR unit. 12mm. 0.89g. Winged beast stepping r, ringed-pellets around./ Horse r, foreleg raised, [DVB]NOV above. ABC 321, VA 171, BMC 2499-501, S 179. *Gd VF, toned silver, bold animals.*  
**RR** **£275**

**REGINI** West Sussex.

**11. Phallic Geometric.** Sills Class 3, British Ad2, Geometric, rev.die 17. c.55-45 BC. AV quarter stater. 10mm. 1.49g. Phallic motif./ Geometric pattern with block and bars. ABC 533, VA 1227, BMC 419-27, DK 136, S 46. *Nr EF, golden gold, clear genitalia.*  
**R** type, **RRRR** reverse die, only two others recorded. **£300**  
 "A nice heavy specimen" says Dr John Sills (pers.comm. 13.6.2019).

**BELGAE** Solent area, inc. Danebury and Chichester.

**12. Chute.** c.65-58BC. AV stater. 17-19mm. 5.97g. Wreath pattern with downward facing leaves./ Disjointed triple-tailed horse l, blobs, dots and shrimp above, crab below, 'coffee bean' behind. ABC 746, VA 1205, BMC 35-76, DK 302, S 22. *Gd VF, large flan of pale yellow gold, crabby crab.* **£500**

**REGINI and ATREBATES** in alliance.

**13. Verica Circles.** c.AD10-42. AR unit. 13mm. 1.10g. V[ERI]CA COMMI F around central ring-and-pellet./ Naturalistic lion bounding r, raised tail, upturned crescent above, REX below. ABC 1229, VA 505, BMC 1332-59, S 132. *Gd VF, bright silver, bold inscription. Ex David Turner coll.* **S** **£285**

**14. Verica Viric.** c.AD10-40. AR minim. 8mm. 0.27g. VIRIC on plain field, beaded border./ Boar r, C above, O below. ABC 1280, VA 423, 510-1, BMC 1519-20, S 146. *EF, complete inscription, beautiful boar. Ex Dr Josef Brewi coll.* **RR** **£185**

**15. Epaticcus Eagle.** c.AD20-40. AR unit. 11mm. 1.14g. Herculean bust of Epaticcus r, wearing lionskin headdress, EPATI before, beaded border./ Spread-winged Roman eagle, head turned to l, talons clutching S-shaped snake, beaded border. ABC 1346, VA 580, BMC 2024-2293, S 356. *Gd VF, bright silver, lovely eagle.* **£150**

**ICENI** Norfolk, N Suffolk, NE Cambs.

**16. Norfolk Wolf. Left Type. Debased Official.** Talbot dies T/54. c.50-30 BC. Base gold stater. 17mm. 4.63g. Wreath motif./ Wolf l, bristly back, crescent and pellet above, 'mapping pin' below. ABC-, VA-, BMC 235, S-. *VF, yellow gold, clear bristly wolf.*

**RRR** die pair, only three others recorded. **£550**  
 Dr Talbot says some debased and plated staters were struck from 'official' dies. The 'mapping pin' is a die flaw.

**17. Snettisham Wreath.** Talbot dies D/6. c.15BC-5AD. AV quarter. 9mm. 1.05g. Wreath motif./ Long-legged annulate horse r, ringed-pellet below. ABC 1462, VA-, BMC 3422-34, S 429. *Gd VF, rose gold, bold horse. Ex Philip T Ashton coll.* **RRR** die pair, only seven others recorded. **£320**

**18. Norfolk Boar Phallic.** c.AD10-25. AR unit. 13mm. 0.98g. Stylised boar r, long bristles, pellet below, sun-sceptre before./ Horse r, phallic motif and pellet triads below. ABC 1582, VA 659, BMC 3482, S 431. *Gd VF, lightly toned silver, bold horse, clear phallic symbol.* **£125**





**19. Crescent Corn Ears.** c.AD25-43. AR unit. 13mm. 1.08g. Back-to-back crescents, ring above and below in centre of corn ear wreath motif./ Curvy horse l, pellets on chest, wheel and neck torc above, ringed-pellet below. ABC 1591, VA 675, BMC 3767-74, S 435. *Gd VF, bold wreath, well ornamented, whole torc revealed.* **£250**

The Icenii were famous for their gold neck trocs. Dio Cassius says Boudica always wore one.

**20. Corn Ear Quatrefoil.** c.AD25-43. AR half unit. 10mm. 0.38g. Corn-ear wreath motif, central ringed-pellet./ Globular horse l. ABC 1606, VA-, BMC 3256-57, S 401. *VF, bright silver, bold horse.*

**RRR** only 15 others recorded **£220**

**CORIELTAVI** E Midlands, from Humber to Welland.

**21. South Ferriby.** c.45-10 BC. AV stater. 16-22mm. 5.52g. Wreath motif./ Lunate horse l, star below. ABC 1743, VA 811, BMC 3148-78, S 390. *Gd VF, huge flan of rose gold, sharp wreath. Fd. East Yorkshire.* **£475**

**22. South Ferriby Shrimp.** Rich Type 24f. c.55-45 BC. AR unit. 10-13mm. 1.10g. Front leg of boar, pellet and line exergual decoration./ Horse r, belted neck and belly. ABC-, VA-, BMC-, S-. *VF, lightly toned.*

**RRR** only six others recorded **£75**

**23. Stork Head Right.** Rich Type 38g. c.55-45 BC. AR half unit. 11mm. 0.44g. Blank./ Horse r, pellet daisy above, pellet below head, pellet triad under tail. ABC 1833, VA 879, BMC 3251-55, S 400. *EF, bright silver, as struck, well centred horse, bold pellets. Ex Michael O'Bea collection. Found Ulceby Cross, Lincs., by Michael O'Bea.*

**RRRR** only five others recorded **£150**

**DOBUNNI** Cotswolds, cap. Corinium (Cirencester).

**24. Anted Head. TED Type.** c.AD 20-43. AR unit. 15mm. 0.86g. Head r, with stalk lips, s-shapes and pellets around./ Triple-tailed horse l, AN below, TED and pellet above. ABC 2072, VA 1082, BMC 3035, S 380. *Gd VF, lightly toned, full inscription. Fd. near Tetbury, Glos.* **R £250**

**25. Cotswold Oxo.** Head Type F. c.10BC-AD10. AR unit. 13mm. 0.86g. Head r, S-shapes, ringed-pellets around./ Annulate horse l, small cross above, ringed-pellet in front. ABC 2027, VA 1078, BMC 2981-3000, S 377. *VF, lightly toned, bold horse. Fd. South Cerney, Glos., 1994-95.* **£175**

**DUOTRIGES** Wessex, cap. Durnovaria (Dorchester).

**26. Cranborne Chase.** c.58-40 BC. AR stater. 19mm. 4.32g. Wreath motif./ Horse l, pellets around, 'coffee bean' behind. ABC 2157, VA 1235-1, BMC 2525-636, S 367. *Good VF/VF, large flan, bright silver, bold wreath. Ex Neil Halsey coll. Fd. Badbury Rings, Dorset.* **£85**

**27. Hod Hill.** c.58-40 BC. Bronze stater. 17-19mm. 4.00g. Wreath motif./ Disjointed horse l, pellets. ABC 2175, VA 1290, BMC 2790-2859, S 371. *Gd VF/VF, glossy olive green patina, sharp wreath.* **£75**

**TRINOVANTES** Essex, S. Suffolk, cap. Camulodunon (Colchester).

**28. Early Clacton.** Sills class 2a, Clacton Curved Exergue. c.60-50 BC. AV stater. 20mm. 5.31g. Wreath motif./ Horse r, pellets above, 'coffee bean' in front and behind, zigzag exergual decoration. ABC 2329, VA 1455, BMC 145-79, DK 406, S 27. *VF, large flan, pale silvery gold, nice horse, superb zigzag decoration. Fd. Braintree, Essex.* **S £750**

This colossal Early Clacton gold stater reveals a hidden face which hasn't been published before. Normally you see either the eye behind the horse or the eye in front of it, but never both on the same coin. A similar concealed 'spirit face' can occasionally be spotted on North East Coast staters of the Corieltavi (ABC fig.133, p.91).



**29. Clacton Star.** Sills class 2b. c.60-50 BC. AV quarter. 14mm. 1.31g. Traces of wreath motif./ Horse r, 'coffee bean' behind, pellets above, star between horse's legs. ABC-, VA-, BMC-, DK 414 (**this coin**), S-. CCI 94.1397 (**this coin**). *Broken and neatly repaired, otherwise Fine, clear horse with star visible. Ex Dr John Sills coll, ex Geoff Cottam coll. Fd. Ipswich, Suffolk.*

**RRR** only 5 others recorded **£275**

First published by Chris Rudd in 1992 (**this coin**) and by Spink in 2015 (**this coin**), this excessively rare Clacton Star is mentioned twice in Dr John Sills' monumental *Divided Kingdoms* (Chris Rudd 2017), pp.435 and 469 (**this coin**). Where else will you find such a significant, scarce and well documented gold quarter stater for under £300?

**30. Tasciovanos Verlamion. Three Pellet Type.** Sills class 4b. VER[L]/TASC[I]. c.25BC-AD10. AV quarter. 10mm. 1.28g. Wreath motif, three pellets between crescents, VERL in angles./ Horse l, beaded mane, bucranium above, T between front legs, A below. ABC-, VA-, BMC-, DK 525, S-. F/Gd VF, rose gold, full bodied horse, clear bucranium.

**RRR** only ten others recorded. **£250**

Only the third we've had. The British Museum has none.

united by Cunobelinus.

**31. Cunobelinus Linear.** Sills class 2. c.AD8-41. AV stater. 18mm. 5.40g. Ear of barley with long whiskers, CA to l, MV to r./ Horse leaping r, linear mane, branch and two pellets above, CVN below, beaded border. ABC 2774, VA 1925, BMC 1772-83, DK 551, S 281. VF, big flan of rose gold, slight pitting on reverse, bold CVN. **£550**

**32. Cunobelinus Winged Victory.** c.AD8-41. AR unit. 10mm. 1.25g. Bust r, CV[NO] behind, [BELIN]VS in front./ Winged Victory standing on globe, traces of inscription around. ABC 2882, VA-, BMC 1883, S 316. VF, lightly toned silver, bold bust. Not in Van Arsdell. **RR £125**

**33. Cunobelinus Warriors.** c.AD8-41. AE unit. 17mm. 2.44g. Warrior on horse r, [CV] behind, NOB below./ Warrior standing l, holding spear and shield, TASCIO [VANTIS] around, beaded border. ABC 2963, VA 2093, BMC 1961-67, S 338. VF, large flan, glossy greeny-brown patina. Ex John Scaife coll. **£95**

**ANGLO-SAXON**

**34. Anglo-Saxon Blank.** c.AD 575-650. Gold flan for thrymsa or tremissis. 9mm. 1.27g. Circular gold-alloy coin flan, flat both sides with multi-faceted edge. Gd VF, pale yellow gold. Found near Manston, Kent.

**RRR** as Kentish find **£150**

Fabric, weight, silvery gold alloy and provenance all suggest this could be an early Anglo-Saxon or imported Merovingian flan, rather than iron age. David Holman says: "For blank Merovingian parallels, see Crondall and Sutton Hoo. I got one on the Lyminge dig a few years ago which is very similar to those" (pers.comm. 18.6.2019).

**CHEAPO-CHEAPO!** all low grade, none over £30.

**35. Antedios Anted D-Bar.** Icení. c.AD 25-43. AR unit. 10-13mm. 0.62g. Double moon emblem on vertical wreath./ Horse r, corn-ear mane, row of three pellets below. ABC 1645. 1/3 missing, otherwise VF, lightly toned AR. **£20**

**36. Duro Thunderbolt.** Durotriges. c.20BC-AD10. AR quarter. 12mm. 0.36g. Blank./ Thunderbolt. ABC 2217. Fine, bright silver, clear thunderbolt. **£15**

**37. Addedomaros Corded.** Catuvellauni. c.45-25 BC. AE unit. 11-14mm. 0.88g. Head l, corded hair./ Horse l. ABC 2544. Fine, light green patina. Ex Clifton coll. **S £25**

**38. Tasciovanos Sea Horse.** Catuvellauni. c.25BC-AD10. AE unit. 15mm. 1.82g. Bearded head r./ Sea-horse l, inscription below. ABC 2658/2661. Fair, clear head. **£30**

**39. Cunobelinus Cunobelini.** Catuvellauni & Trinovantes. c.AD8-41. AE unit. 13mm. 2.15g. CVNOBELINI in two lines./ Victory seated l. ABC 2918. VF, clear Victory. **£30**
