1. Cunobelinus Horseman. c.AD8-41. AR unit. 12mm. 1.25g. CVNO BELI in two panels, star above and below, beaded border./ Horseman r, CVN below, beaded border. ABC 2858, VA 1951, BMC 1862, S 302. Near EF, good silver, sharp CVNOBELI. An exceptionally nice example. Ex Gloucestershire coll. This bareback horseman wears a wide-brimmed cavalry helmet, signifying rank, but seems otherwise unclad, or in skin-tight breeches. His hands-free skills equal those of Cunobelin's father



Tasciovanos' horseman (ABC 2577, 2580). Note how tightly his right leg is crooked, showing how he guides a speeding horse, mane flying, with neither bit nor bridle: he waves his right hand or brandishes a light weapon. Both kings, probably fine horsemen themselves, will have kept a permanent troop of household cavalry, and this silver issue of c.AD 15-20, often found in Catuvellaunian home territory, may have been designed to please them.

See John Sills Gaulish and early British gold coinage (Spink 2003), p.128, fig. 28f. Classes 2a and 2b both equate to stater class 2.

5. Bayeaux Head Boar. Aux sangliers, en or allié. Série 341, var. 1. c.80-60 BC. Baiocasses. Base AV stater. 21mm. 6.65g. Head r, boar in hair./ Human-headed horse r, boar standard below. ABC 55, de Jersey fig. 57a, LT 6982, DT 2254. PAS: HAMP-91A107 (this coin). Nr VF, golden hue, good head. Ex Hayling Island hoard, T 52, 2022, fd. 18.1.2022.

RRR as UK find £550

The Baiocasses ('with blond curls') were based in Bessin, Lower Normandy, and gave their name to modern Bayeux. In 2019 when we valued the huge Jersey hoard (Le Câtillon II) of 70,000 coins we noted only one other of this type. Only Liz's List offers you rarities like this for under £1000.

Bretagne 1960, p.88, Pèronne 238. Gd VF, lighty toned silver, bold haircurls, clear horse. Ex Royal Berkshire coll., bt. CR (1993), ex Le Catillon hoard, Jersey, 1957.

Depeyrot VIII (2005), no.185, records only seven others. £500 This type corresponds to Anchor Nose silver staters, Rybot 75-89, War Coins of the Sun Warriors, p.68-70) Coriosolite quarters are much, much scarcer than Coriosolite staters and few have been found in Britain. This coin comes from the well publicised Le Câtillon hoard, Jersey, 1957.

RR only 19 recorded £350

This is the long-lost quarter stater that was almost certainly issued to accompany the full Yarmouth stater, ABC 518, and the Chichester Chariot Wheel silver unit, ABC 701, both of which have three radial lines, as does the Yarmouth quarter. This lovely example first appeared on the open market (in 1995) and was first seen by Chris Rudd and Dr John Sills over ten years ago. For more information about this elusive and enigmatic type see *Chris Rudd* Auction 183, Lot 7.

RR only 23 others this pair of dies £750

In his definitive review of South Ferriby staters Dr John Sills writes: "The South Ferriby series at Mint B opens with Derek Allen's N type, ABC 1737, which has a Ferriby forked hairbar combined with a late North East Coast reverse, with a rosette below the horse (*Fig.8*). The last obverse die links with several reverses that have a star in place of a rosette and define the start of the South Ferriby type proper" (*Chris Rudd List* 118, July 2011, p.2-4).

855-7, BMC 3202, S-. VF/Gd VF, good silver, beautifully ornamented, clear horse. Fd. Moggerhanger, Beds., Jan. 2020. RRR Rich records only 13 examples in the Celtic Coin Index, inc. this one.

This superbly well centred horse has a beautifully braided tail, the like of which you are unlikely to see again on any other British Celtic coin. Note too the vertical lines in exergue which give the impression that the horse is standing in long grass. An imaginative and innovative variation of a familiar equine theme, exceptionally well executed.

RRR only eight others recorded, inc. one in the BM £600 In 1998 we speculated about the possible RO behind the horse (Richard Hobbs also thought it might be a letter R), Chris Rudd List 38, No.67. Dr John Sills says: "This is the first example with a definite R, which may be a die cutting error but alternatively could

be an abbreviation of Rigon, as seen on late Tasciovanos staters, ABC 2577-2580; the Two Serpents unit is an early type that is broadly contemporary with Rigon gold." (pers.comm. 18.10.2023). See Philip de Jersey, Cunoblin's silver, *Chris Rudd List* 63, May 2002, pp.5-9.
