ABC 2763, VA 1903, BMC 1756-58, S 274. CCI 92.0447 (this coin). Gd VF, dark-green patina, sharp squares and bold eagle. Ex Royal Berkshire coll, bt. Chris Rudd (1992), ex Chris Rudd coll, (with original ticket). Fd. c.1990.



The obverse and reverse are reminiscent of the Eppillus Rex silver unit, ABC 1160. A similar concave-sided square occurs on a Danebury minim, ABC 1046. It is nearly 10 years since we sold our last example of this type. Will you have to wait another 10 years for the next? "One of the best of the 28 recorded coins" says Dr John Sills (pers.comm.30.8.2024).

Gd VF, neat flan of golden gold, smooth surfaces, well centred horse Fd. Attleborough, Norfolk, 2010-19.

Struck to pay troops to fight Caesar. See Dr John Sills, Identifying Gallic War Uniface staters, *Chris Rudd List* 83, September 2005, p.2-6.

Watkins coll.* £325 "The Four Symbols/Two Symbols issue, is of neater style and initially has four symbols below the central bar on the reverse, subsequently reduced to two." *Divided Kingdoms*, p.15.

RRRR only a few known examples, all from hoards £220 David Holman, Cantiaci coin specialist, says "Distinctly uncommon – apart from this one, the few known examples are all from hoards" (pers.comm. 23.7.2024).

8. Amminus Wreath Box. c.AD 30-40. AE unit. 14mm. 2.26g. AM in central panel inside wreath./ Horse stepping r, head facing, DVNO below, beaded border. ABC 468, VA 193, BMC-, S 189. Gd VF, dark green patina, bold wreath, clear inscription. RR only 17 others recorded, "most of them grotty" says Dr John Sills. £400 Is Sego- (ABC 441-453) a place, not a person? And, if so, could it be the same place as Duno-? "If Dunon was renamed Segodunon by Tasciovanos, it could still have been known colloquially as Dunon" says Dr John Sills (Chris Rudd List 132, p.3).

11. Verica Eagle. Regini & Atrebates. c.AD10-40. AR unit. 13mm. 1.21g. COMF in plain tablet, scroll decoration with neck torcs above and below, line and beaded border./ Spread-winged eagle standing, head turned to l, [V]I R[I] above, beaded border. ABC 1226, VA 471, BMC 1485-505, S 138. VF/Gd VF, full COMF, bold eagle.

"The most important symbolism of eagles concerns their association with the Roman sky-god Jupiter...Romano-Celtic images of the

Sun-god frequently appear in western Europe with the Celtic solar wheel and the Roman eagle." Dictionary of Celtic Myth and Legend, Miranda J.Green. This eagle, with wings outstretched, denotes a strong, agile bird and is a good copy of the reverse of a quadrans of Augustus, RCV 1707, dated between 15 and 10 BC.

AR unit. 14mm. 0.78g. Back-to-back crescents./ Horse r, corn ear mane, blundered S below head, ECEN and row of pellets below. ABC-, VA-, BMC-, COI 89b, S-. Gd VF, lightly toned, bold moons. RRRR only ten other this pair of dies recorded £220

ABC-, VA-, BMC 3150, S-. Gd VF, virtually as minted, large flan of rose gold, clear face. Ex East Anglian coll. Fd. near Gainsborough, Lincs., pre. 2009. £650 Hidden 'spirit' faces are a distinctive feature of Ancient British coins and probably derive from the powerful influence that British Druids apparently had in die design. Is this the face of the goddess Litavis?

CCI 04.0246 (this coin). Gd F, glossy green patina, oval flan, clear DVM. Ex Royal Berkshire coll, bt. CR (2004). Fd. Scarborough, Yorks.

- **21. Potterne Moon Head.** c.30-1 BC. Billon unit. 9mm. 0.83g. Moon-head r, large crescents for hair, sunburst on chin./ Horse l, pellet above. ABC 2131, VA-, BMC 604-05, 3018, S-. VF, chunky flan, bold head. Ex M Parker coll. Fd. Devizes, Wilts., 1990s.

22. Cranborne Chase. c.58-40 BC. AR stater. 17mm. 5.16g. Wreath motif./ Horse l, pellets above, 'coffee bean' behind. ABC 2157, VA 1235-1, BMC 2525-46, S 366. Gd VF, chunky flan, good silver. Ex 'Bristol' coll. £300

23. Badbury Rat. DQS Geometric class 4, die group 5.4, dies O12/R29. c.20BC-AD20. AR quarter stater. 12mm. 0.89g. Traces of 'three-men-in-a-boat'./ Central zigzag thunderbolt between beaded lines, 'clamshell' motif to r, 'rat' below. ABC 2214, VA 1260, BMC 2748-70, S 368. CCI 23.1401 (this coin). Gd VF, well ornamented, clear rat. One of the nicest examples we've seen for a long time. Ex N Bundle coll. Fd. Winterborne St Martin, Dorset.

RRR only 14 others this pair of dies recorded £250 Dr David Robinson's recently published book *Durotigan Quarter Staters* contains die identifications, rarities and findspots (where known) of this large series, plus maps and tables. Published on p.161 (this coin).

24. Two Boars. c.50-30 BC. AE unit. 12mm. 1.76g. Two boars, wheel./ Horse r. ABC 2315, VA-, BMC 402-06, S-. CCI 10.2754 (this coin). GdVF, holly-green patina, great boars, lovely horse. One of the prettiest examples we've had. Ex Royal Berkshire coll, bt. CR (2009), ex Michael J Grover coll.

25. Tasciovanos Acorn. Stepping Horse Type. Sills class 2. c.25 BC-AD 10. AV quarter stater. 12mm. 1.19g. Crossed wreaths motif of triple lines, central line beaded, one curved, one straight, back-to-back crescents at centre, 'teardrop' in each quarter./ Horse l, beaded mane, foreleg raised, pellet above, acorn below. ABC 2586, VA 1688, BMC 1651-53, DK 519, S 221. VF/Gd VF, golden gold, full bodied horse. **\$£650**

We've previously speculated that the nut-like object under the high-stepping horse may be an acorn on a twig and hinted at possible Druidic connections (*Chris Rudd List* 38, No.56). A similar nut-like symbol can sometimes be seen on Tasciovanos Hidden Faces staters (ABC 2553), and Tasciovanos Camul quarters (ABC 2589). There were some great oak-rich forests around *Verlamion* (Hatfield Forest and Epping Forest to name but two), so we think the acorn will have been a familiar and meaningful nut to Iron Age rulers in Hertfordshire and Essex.

- **RR** type, this legend variant **RRR** only six others recorded £385 Normally the inscription reads TASC. On this blundered and excessively rare example the letters in the panel read TASI. Clearly a mistake and an easy mistake to make because the king's name was often shortened to TASCI.
- **27. Tasciovanos War Trumpet.** c.20BC-AD10. AE unit. 15mm. 2.09g. Short-haired male head r./ Warrior on horse r, holding carnyx and large shield, [VER] below. ABC 2676, VA 1750-1, BMC 1724-27, S 246. VF, dark green patina,









rugged head (portrait of Tascio?). Fd. Upper Dean, Beds., 1997. RR £150

28. Andoco Crescent Wreath. Sills class 1, dies 2/2. c.10BC-AD10. AV quarter stater. 12mm. 1.30g. Crossed-wreath motif with back to back crescents in centre, ANDO in angles./ Full-bodied horse l, phallic bucranium above, spoked wheel below. ABC 2718, VA 1863, BMC 2015-17, DK 532, S 263. CCI 02.0161 (this coin). Gd VF, rose gold, full inscription, bold horse. Ex Winchester coll. Found Baldock, Herts., 2002. RR only 24 this pair of dies recorded £650 Although this coin uses an abbreviation ANDO, other coins of this apparently short-reigned ruler are inscribed ANDOC or ANDOCO. In fact, his name could have been longer, such as Andocomios or Andocomborios, a British version of Andecomborios, one of two legates of the Remi, sent to Caesar early in 57BC. Published in Divided Kingdoms p.580 and 614 (this coin).

The dog is a pun on Cuno ('dog'). A deliberate pun.

30. Cunobelinus Flower. c.AD 8-41. AR unit. 13mm. 1.15g. Floral motif, CA to l, and MV to r, within pellet border./ Horse prancing r, head turned back, CVNO in exergue, within pellet border. ABC 2885, VA 2049, BMC 1867A, S 305, CCI 00.1534 (this coin). Gd F/Nr VF, lightly toned silver, centrally positioned floral motif, bold horse, most of inscription visible. Ex Royal Berkshire coll., bt. CR (2000), ex Cotswold coll. RR only 17 others inc. one in BM £400 Like most of Group E Late vegetal issue coins, this bears Cunobelin's name with the Camulodunum mint. For more information on Cunobelin's silver see Chris Rudd List 63.

31. Cunobelinus Rex. c.AD 8-41. AE unit. 15mm. 2.51g. Bust l, [CVNOBE] IINVS REX around, beaded border./ Bull butting r, TASC in exergue, beaded border. ABC 2966, VA 2095, BMC 1944-51, S 340. *Gd VF, lovely head, sharp inscription, strong green patina.* £250 The title *rex* may have been given to Cuno by Tiberius.

32. Cunobelinus Stepping Horse. c.AD 8-41. AE unit. 15-17mm. 2.37g. CVNO in double-lined rectangular box, enclosed within acorn-wreath border./ Roman-style horse stepping elegantly to r, head turned towards us, CAMV below on exergual line. VA 2101, BMC 1987-90, S 344. CCI 97.1547 (this coin). VF, dark green patina, bold horse, complete inscription. Ex BR coll, bt. CR (2001), ex Dr J.T. Perry coll, bt. CR (1997).

CHEAPO-CHEAPO! all low grade, none over £35.

33. Addedomaros Solar Flower. Catuvellauni. c.45-25 BC. AE unit. 12mm. 1.33g. Head l, corded hair./ Horse stepping l, annulate head and body, solar flower below. ABC 2541.

VF, clear braided hair, full horse stepping spritely. Found Essex/ Cambs., 1980s-90s. \$ £35


"They are always washing their hair in lime-water" to make it coarse like a horse's mane" (Diodorus Siculus, 5.28).
