As with D1/1-1a, the axis is 90. The style of both sides is very similar. As with 1a, there is no neckline (the central slash). The head completes the curve at the rear, which isn't visible on 1a. The



bull is of the same archaic style and appears to copy A2/1-1. This coin possibly has the remnant of a front leg (or head), but that is far from certain, and the mark here may be slight variation from the mould rather than part of the design. Fascinating." (pers.comm. 7.11.2024).
